The most recent meeting of the Board of Commissioners was held on Friday, July 27th at the office of The Interior Regional Housing Authority. Members of the Doyon NAHASDA Oversight Committee were in attendance, as well as Steve Ginnis of the Tanana Chiefs Conference and Charlene Fisher, Chief, of the Beaver Traditional Council.

Many issues were presented to the Board for consideration, among them were the IRHA Self-Monitoring Report, a newly formatted Financial Report that will be supplied to Doyon and the Villages that IRHA serves, on a monthly basis for tracking project costs, etc., and the IRHA 2000 Audit. Also addressed was the Doyon Designation Agreement, which the Board adopted and will be signed by all parties before the next Board Meeting on August 31, 2001 at 9:00 A.M.



The Board was also given a presentation on the AMERIND insurance program.

A potluck lunch was served in the IRHA warehouse for all those attending the Board meeting, as well as the IRHA employees. Good food and visiting was had by all, then it was back to work and the board meeting in the afternoon.
